


Literacy and English - Reading



Use the **title**, **picture** and **blurb** to choose a book to read.

- What did you **think** of this book?
- What did you **like or dislike** about it?
- Tell someone **why** you like that part
- What is this book about?
- What **language** is the book in?
- Draw a **picture** of your favourite part

Numeracy and Mathematics - 3D Objects



Starter:

Find **3D** objects in your home. (e.g. a ball, a box of cereal)

Can you name them in English/ another language?

Main Challenge:

Look at your objects, pick up your objects
Do the objects **roll**? Do the objects **stack**?
Can you sort them? (Example - Object rolls/Object does not roll)

Health and Wellbeing - Smiles

Share a smile!



1. Draw a smile on lots of bits of paper.
2. **Hide** the smiles in around your home.
3. When someone finds a smile **tell** them something that makes you smile.
4. Ask them what makes them smile.

Check:

- Is there a **full stop** at the end of each statement?
- Is there a **question mark** at the end of each question?

Numeracy and Mathematics - Recognising Numbers

Starter: Look for numbers around you (Example: on doors, in books, on buses)

Main Challenge:
 Choose 2 numbers from 1 to 100.
 Say the numbers (For example: 23 and 56).
 Compare the two numbers
 Which is **larger**? Which is **smaller**?
 Repeat with new numbers



Extra Challenge:
 Which is the **largest/ smallest number**?

Science - Weather



1. Fold a piece of paper in **half**.
2. Fold the paper in **half** again. The paper is now in **4 quarters**.
3. Draw a different kind of weather on each quarter. (e.g. sun, rain, snow, wind)
4. Cut/tear the paper into the **4 quarters**.
5. Talk about the weather every day.
6. Watch the BBC Bitesize clip 'Making weekly weather recordings.'

Modern Languages




Main Challenge:

Spelling task resource

<p>LOOK</p> 	<p>Look at the word. How many parts are there? What are the tricky bits? Can you find any spelling patterns?</p>
<p>SAY</p> 	<p>Say the word to yourself. Break the word into syllables. How many parts are there? What sounds can you hear?</p>
<p>COVER</p> 	<p>Cover up the word so you cannot see it. Picture the word in your mind.</p>
<p>WRITE</p> 	<p>Write down the word, remembering how it sounds and what it looks like.</p>
<p>CHECK</p> 	<p>Check to see if it is correct. Tick the letters you got correct. Write the word correctly if you made any mistakes.</p>
